# Innovating for the Future: Samonix's Aquaculture Technology

I am excited to share the potential of Samonix's proposed project in the Outaouais.

This initiative seeks to establish a large-scale, land-based aquaculture farm, using groundbreaking technology to raise high-quality Atlantic salmon. Rooted in the circular economy, Samonix is committed to minimizing waste and creating a sustainable, eco-friendly model for salmon farming that protects our environment and strengthens our region's economy.

As climate change increasingly disrupts traditional fisheries, I believe Samonix's innovative approach could be a key contributor to global food security. This project has the potential to position the Outaouais—and Quebec technology—on the world stage as a leader in sustainable aquaculture. Recognizing this potential, the federal government has committed \$100,000 to support the start-up of this project.
